







AND BY ALTERNATIVE WE MEAN NUDE

It's a story that needs little introduction: the phrase "Calendar Girls" is now synonymous with a group of women who, in 1999, changed the face of the Women's Institute forever with their 'alternative' calendar.

John Baker was diagnosed with non-Hodgkin lymphoma in February 1998. He sadly passed away aged 54 after just a few months of treatment. In the months following John's death, his wife Angela looked for something to focus on during this difficult time. Her friend and fellow Women's Institute member Tricia Stewart suggested they find a fun way to raise money for a new sofa on the ward where John was treated. They soon settled on the idea of a nude calendar.

Tricia's idea was to produce a playful twist on traditional WI calendars. These typically featured hills, sheep and village greens, theirs would feature cream buns, pianos and watering cans. Eleven members of the Rylstone and District Women's Institute took part in the calendar. The photos were taken one October evening by local artist Terry Logan whose wife, Lynda, would be Miss July. Terry tried to match each lady to a pose which played to her strengths, be it good legs or a talent. "Angela played piano, for example, so I shot her at a piano". The calendar was launched on 12 April 1999 with an initial print run of 1000 copies that increased to 5000 to make it financially viable. It captured the public's hearts, attracted mass media attention worldwide and went on to sell 88,000 copies that year alone. The ladies were voted Women of the Year and presented calendars to the Queen and the Oueen Mother.

From Yorkshire to Hollywood & Beyond

In 2000, the calendar was published in America and sold 240,000 copies. The girls posed for further calendars in 2004, 2005 and 2007, as well as a recipe calendar in 2008 and a ten-year anniversary edition in 2010

In 2003 writer Tim Firth and director Nigel Cole bought the girl's phenomenal story to the silver screen with an all-star cast that included Helen Mirren, Julie Walters and Celia Imrie. The film was a huge international success, the fictional representation capturing the feelings of loss, friendship and humour central to the original story. Fun fact - the original girls can be seen in the film as a rival Womens Institute at the Spring Fete.

In 2009 Tim Firth adapted the story once again, this time into a hit stage show starring Lynda Bellingham as Chris, who is based on Tricia. The show premiered in Chichester before transferring the Noel Coward Theatre in the West End and went on to tour the world.

Three years later in 2012, Gary Barlow and Tim Firth began writing songs for a musical based on the tireless fundraisers. The musical, originally called 'The Girls' opened at the Leeds Grand Theatre in 2015 before transferring in 2017 to the Phoenix Theatre in London's West End. The show received widespread acclaim and the cast opened the 2017 Olivier Awards. Then in 2018, the show went out on a 15 month UK tour under the revised title 'Calendar Girls: The Musical'

Let's talk about sunflowers

John grew them from the onset of his illness and gave them to family and friends in the hope that he would be in remission by the time that they flowered. Sadly, this was not the case, but the sunflower lives on as a reminder of John's life and the fabulous achievement of the eleven courageous women from Yorkshire.






